Women Build, a program of Habitat for Humanity Washington County (HFHWC), completed its third home just in time for Ruth Tinney and her two sons to move in before the holiday season.

Built at 951 Concord Street, the home was dedicated on November 22nd.

Ruth and her sons, John (16) and Anthony (15), were excited and grateful to have a home of their own. Ruth said at the dedication, "It is much more than I expected." Her home was crowded at the dedication by volunteers who wanted to meet the latest recipients of a Women Build home and to start them on their way with many blessings. Along with the keys to her home, Ruth

received several gifts, including a family Bible and a homeowner's manual.

The house is about 925 square feet with three bedrooms and one bathroom. Ruth said that her new backyard is much nicer than the one she was leaving. The landscaping was a gift

from the Town and Country Garden Club.

Pam Meredith, chairwoman of Women Build, said, "The house was completed in record time. We started on Saturday, September 6th and finished just before Thanksgiving. We had a great group of women and men on this project. We worked Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays to get Ruth and her boys into their home before the holidays."

"Women's Build is wonderful, and Habitat is wonderful," said Tinney. "I've always wanted to own my own home. I've wanted it really bad. It feels wonderful."

Ruth works two jobs in order to support herself and her sons. She works as a food service assistant at Bester Elementary School and at Food Lion. Ruth is grateful

Thrivent Financial & Lutherans to Build Habitat House in '09

Habitat for Humanity of Washington County has been awarded **\$75,962 or 65 percent of the funds necessary, to build 1 home (including land) in 2009 through Thrivent Financial for Lutherans' Thrivent Builds program.** Lutheran churches in Washington County have pledged to raise an additional \$11,600 or 10% of the funds for the house. The home will be built on Lanvale Street in Hagerstown by area volunteers, of whom at least one-half will be Lutheran and one-fourth will be Thrivent Financial members. The Habitat partner family will also contribute hundreds of hours of "sweat equity" helping to build their own home. A groundbreaking ceremony will be held April 4, 2009 to kick off the build, and construction is scheduled to begin in late April.

The alliance between Habitat for Humanity International and Thrivent

Financial for Lutherans continues to build hope for low-income families amidst economic difficulties as the mortgage crisis unfolds nationwide. Since 2005, it has given more than 1,000 families an opportunity to achieve the American dream of homeownership. In 2009, Thrivent Builds with Habitat for Humanity will contribute more than **\$24 million** to help build another **314 affordable homes in 37 states and the District of Columbia.** Hundreds of local Habitat affiliates will build these homes alongside Lutherans, members of Thrivent Financial and other community volunteers.

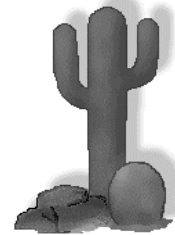
